

- Well connected by the Danube and motorways
- Member of the United Nations
- Upper-middle income economy
- Developed agriculture, industry and services

RURAL SERBIA

- Favorable land and climate
- Fertile Pannonian Plain in Vojvodina
- Large rural potential
- Diverse agricultural production: crop field (70%) & cattle (30%)
- World second largest producer of:

raspberries & plums

URBANIZATION OF SERBIA

- Before the Second World War: over 80% of the population lived in villages
- After the Second World War: rapid urbanization increase of urban settlements decrease of countryside inhabitants












Military Mokrin (1760)



COMMUNAL MERGING (2015)


